

The Use and Impact of Sports Premium 2018/2019



What is the Sports Premium?

The Government has provided funding of £150 million per annum since 2013 to 'provide new, substantial primary school sport funding'. This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary school head teachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE Provision for all their children.

The sport funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools. With our school being eligible for £1,000 per eligible pupil. Funding is spread out over the year with 7/12 coming in Oct/Nov and 5/12 in April/May.

Purpose of funding

Schools will have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Possible uses for the funding include:

- Buying specialist app to deliver, assess and self-assess each lesson.
- Paying for professional development opportunities in PE/sport
- Running sport competitions, or increasing participation in the school games
- Buying quality assured professional development modules or materials for PE/sport
- Providing annual residential trips.
- Holiday clubs

How will Alder Brook Primary School be spending the Sports funding and who will benefit?

At our school, we believe that the money must be used so all children benefit regardless of sporting ability; that children who do have access to sporting clubs have the opportunity to try something different.

How will we measure the impact?

We will evaluate the impact of the Sports Premium funding as part of our normal self-evaluation. We will look at how well we use our Sport Premium to improve the quality of PE and sporting provision, including increasing participation in PE and sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of.

Measuring the impact of the activities provided with sports premium funding can be achieved in different ways. We will look at progress in PE as well as other areas of development such as self-esteem, confidence and resilience is improved significantly and the numbers of pupils involved in sporting activities in and out of school. Assessments are made informally using feedback forms from both staff and the pupils. In the next 6 months, we hope to have an assessment system up and running so that teachers can assess at the end of every lesson and also children can self-assess.

Sports Premium Funding 2018-2019

The Sports Premium Funding allows us to offer the pupils at Alder Brook the chance to experience a variety of different sports, which children cannot access out of school. We receive £9,456 over three terms, which is spent as follows:

PE lessons feature a range of skills and games such as ball skills, tennis, dodgeball, bat and ball games, athletics, net and wall games, striking and fielding games, outdoor adventure activities and healthy lifestyles. Numerous cluster events are organised by our cluster group.

Part of our funding was used for our Year 6 trip to Lledr Hall to participate in our yearly residential trip. Here they were able to experience a wide variety of new and different activities such as; canoeing, mining, orienteering, hiking, high ropes and low ropes.

Part of our funding has been used to transport the pupils from different activities to and from school using our mini bus service.

As a school we have been able to enter a variety of cluster lead competitions these have included; bench ball at Godfrey Ermen Primary, Dance at Westwood Park Primary and archery at Christ Church primary. As a cluster, we have a competition set for each half term. These include; American football, gymnastics, dodgeball, athletics, tag rugby etc.

We are working on successfully embedding the Daily Mile across the whole school which allows pupils to gain an extra 15-20 minutes of physical activity a day more than they were getting previously. This has had a positive impact on the pupils focus in class.

As a school we have found that letting the pupils have access to swimming throughout the year has positive benefits such as: by year 6 pupils can swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres. Pupils can use a range of strokes effectively and perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations. Looking at feedback forms, out 33 children, 90% of Pupils can swim confidently.

This year pupils have had access to horse riding at Carrington Riding Centre. The pupils had an hour's lesson, with half an hour stable management and half an hour riding. Here they learnt different techniques from trotting to cantering. In addition, the pupils learned the safety aspects of how to get on and off a horse safely. Feedback from staff showed that 100% of the 33 pupils that attended had a positive impact both at the riding school and at Alder brook.

Moreover, the KS2 pupils attended Helly Hansen Water Sports Centre at Salford Quays during the summer term. They did this for 6 weeks, took part in a different watersports such as kayaking, sailing, raft building, bell boating, canoeing, and paddle boarding. This had a positive impact on the children that attended, as they were able to access different sports that they are not able to access outside of school.

Some of our funding has been spent on getting sports kits so that all pupils are able to feel comfortable and confident when doing P.E. In addition, it allows the pupils to represent our school confidently when out doing competitions.

We have purchased new sports equipment to allow P.E lessons to run smoothly and allow the pupils to get increased range of sports. Some of the equipment purchased includes; tag rugby sets, hockey set, athletic equipment etc.
